Around the Word Devotions + the week of September 18-24, 2022

THEME OF THE WEEK: **Walking by Faith**

This week, we will turn our attention to a few of the times in Scripture that we see our Lord granting the gift of walking. We will consider what it means to walk with Christ, to walk by faith, and the nature of the healing miracles of Christ. All throughout this week, you are encouraged to keep in mind the ultimate healing that Christ gives to His people: the forgiveness of sins. This is promised to all who trust in Christ and walk before Him in faith.

SUN

SCRIPTURE: **Luke 17:11-19 – Returning to Christ**

We often hear about repentance. I'm sure you've been told before that to repent comes from the idea of changing minds. But this text reminds us of the importance of turning to Christ. Yes, we turn away from our sins. But the next step is to turn to Jesus. We turn to Him ever more. We rejoice in the gifts that He gives us and the mercy we receive from Him. It was out of mercy that Jesus cleansed the lepers and it is out of mercy that He cleanses us of our sins. *O Lord Jesus Christ, thank You for the mercy You've shown to me in the forgiveness of sins. Please help me to turn to You all the more fervently. Amen.*

MON

SCRIPTURE: **Psalms 119:105-112 (NUN) – A Lasting Heritage**

How will you be remembered? This is a question that all people wrestle with. We think we need to do something significant or accomplish something to be remembered. But the Psalmist has it right. The Lord's testimonies are our heritage. Let us be remembered as people faithful to the Lord Who has redeemed us and brought us life out of His death. Our lives belong to Him and it is good that we would be remembered as those who were followers of the Lord. This is the joy of being faithful; that our lives are His. *O Lord, may You indeed be my heritage. Let me be remembered as one of Your faithful people by all who know me. Amen.*

TUE

SCRIPTURE: **Galatians 5:16-24 – We Belong to Christ**

What does it mean to belong to Jesus? It means that He crucified the flesh. It means to die to the world. This is why we turn away from those things that Paul describes as the works and desires of the flesh. We do not live being driven by them because we are dead to them and they to us. Our Lord gives us a new life. He has recreated you to be His servant and to walk in His paths. We walk according to the Spirit and seek to fulfill the desires of the Spirit as we live for Him. *Almighty God, give me grace that I might walk in the ways of faith by the light of Your Spirit. Amen.*

WED

SCRIPTURE: **Matthew 9:9-13 – Called by Christ**

Matthew was called to follow Jesus even though many people would not have wanted Matthew as a follower. Tax collectors were hated in those days as many of them were dishonest and extorted money from people. And yet, Jesus called Matthew to follow. Not only that, Jesus also gathered to eat with Matthew and other sinners like him. Jesus has also called you through the Gospel to follow Him. Jesus gathers with other sinners like you when He calls all of us together to worship Him. The focus is not on our sin, but on Christ and the forgiveness He freely gives out of His mercy for us. *O Lord, help me to stay focused on You even when there are other sinners around me, that we might all focus on You rather than our sins. Amen.*

THU

SCRIPTURE: **John 5:1-15 – Take Up Your Bed and Walk**

These words, "Take up your bed and walk" were spoken by our Lord at different times, but always with the same result: the person addressed walked! He did these things to show His authority as the Son to forgive sins. Because Jesus is God, He brings life and health where there is death and disorder. Though we may ourselves be beset by various ailments, illnesses, and disabilities, we too receive the better gift from Christ: the forgiveness of our sins! So let us then also walk with Christ as He has called us and made us His own. *Almighty God, I thank and praise You for the life that You have given me that I might follow after You. Amen.*

FRI

SCRIPTURE: **Acts 3:1-10 – We Have Nothing to Give But Jesus**

In this text, we see Jesus still healing people. But now He does it through Peter. Notice that Peter does not claim the power or authority to heal for himself. He says that he only can give Jesus. And indeed, that is all any pastor has to give. Many pastors desire to be interesting, relevant, or even entertaining. Yet, all that is needful is Christ. It is imperative for us as Christians to always be pointed to Christ for it is only through Him that the healing from sins is given. And that is the one thing needful for us. *O Lord, I need the healing that only You can grant: the healing from my sins. Grant this forgiveness, I pray, for all the sins I have committed against You. Amen.*

SAT

SCRIPTURE: **Psalms 66 – The Glorious Deeds of the Lord**

As we conclude this week, we have focused each day on the healings the Lord did around walking. But this Psalm helps us to once again be reminded that the goodness and works of God are not merely of one type or in the physical realm of health. The gifts of the Lord are many and He gives these gifts to His people. He gives these gifts to you for you belong to Him. Yes, He grants healing for our ailments, but He is always our God. He has done many things for us and given us many blessings. *O Lord, You have blessed me in many ways. When I am hurting and looking for only one type of Your blessings, open my eyes that I might see all of the other blessings You have lavished upon me. Amen.*
