- **General Fund Balance:** \$3,253.96

- **Stewardship**
Luke 10:25 – "And behold, a lawyer stood up to put Him to the test, saying, 'Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?'" That's just not a good question! Doing and inheriting just don't go together. What can you do to inherit the English throne? Nothing. Inheriting is about birth right; doing is about merit. We receive eternal life by birth right in our baptism in Christ. All of our doing in the Kingdom of God flows from who we are by our new birth. It can never be the other way around. So today, we remember St. John the Baptizer, who, because he believed the Lord, walked in His ways and gained the crown of life in martyrdom.

- **Opportunities to Serve Christians Around the World**

This week, we received news of two disasters that have brought devastation to missionaries we at Trinity know well. First, Haiti was rocked by a massive earthquake that has left many without basic needs. Hearts 4 Haiti has issued an appeal for aid to our local congregations. Since those funds are administered by Immanuel in Seymour, you can send any donations to them.

Second, Pastor Eric Stinnett and his family lost everything after a dam near their house broke after heavy rainfall. Some did not escape sudden flooding alive, but nearly everything in the homes affected was lost. The Stinnetts are safe, but the LCMS does not have insurance to cover foreign missionaries. There will be an offering plate by the offering box this week and next week for those who would like to assist this family.

The most important thing you can do is pray for those affected by the devastation in Haiti and Ethiopia, and that God, through His saints, would provide for them during this crisis.
